Building code performance clauses

All relevant building code performance clauses listed in this document:

B2 Durability

B2.3.1

Building elements must, with only normal maintenance, continue to satisfy the performance requirements of this code for the lesser of the *specified intended life* of the *building*, if stated, or:

- (c) 5 years if:
- the *building elements* (including services, linings, renewable protective coatings, and *fixtures*) are easy to access and replace, and
 - failure of those building elements to comply with the *building code* would be easily detected during normal use of the *building*.

F2 Hazardous building materials

F2.3.1

The quantities of gas, liquid, radiation or solid particles emitted by materials used in the *construction of buildings*, shall not give rise to harmful concentrations at the surface of the material where the material is exposed, or in the atmosphere of any space.

- allow effective cleaning,
- discharge to a plumbing and drainage system as required by Clause G13 Foul water when water-borne disposal is used, and
- provide a healthy safe disposal system when non-water-borne disposal is used.

G12 Water Supplies

G12.3.5

Sanitary fixtures and *sanitary appliances* must be provided with hot water when intended to be used for

- utensil washing; and
- personal washing, showering, or bathing.

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
